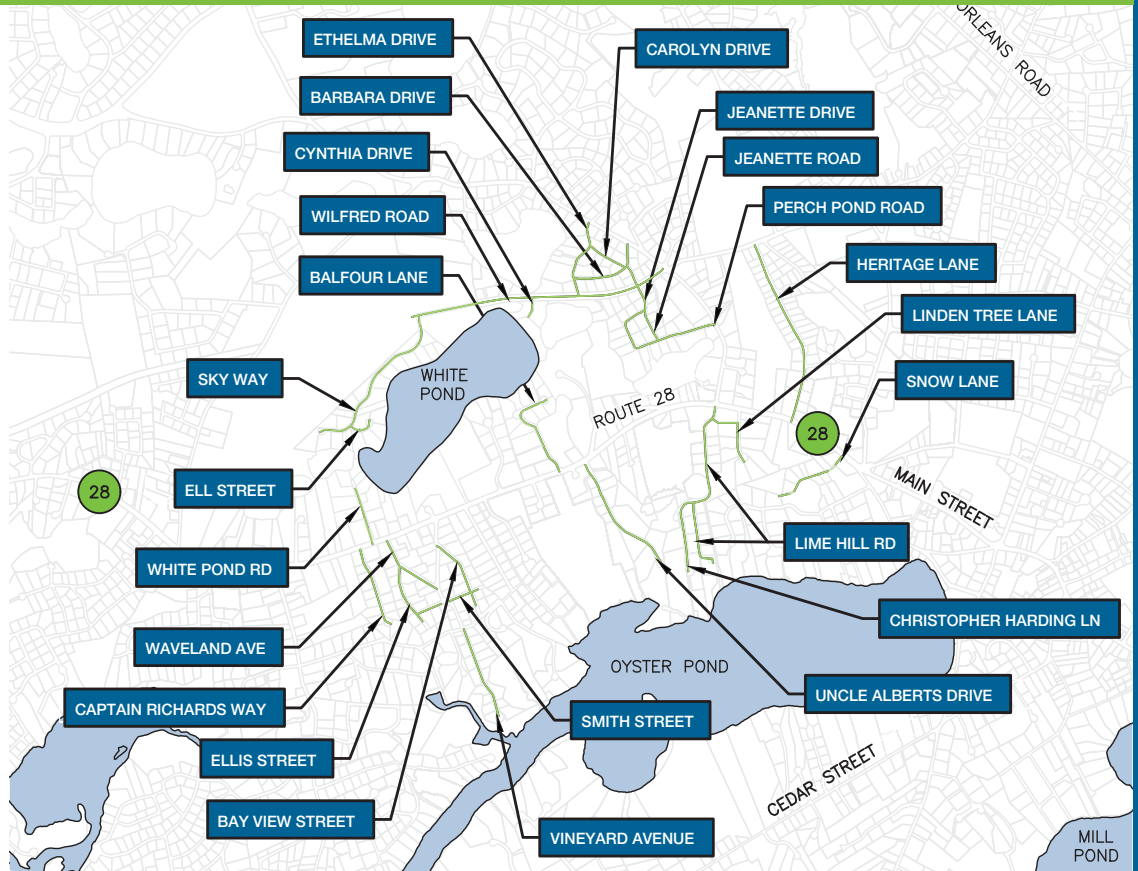




Town of Chatham Collection System Project

The project

Construction of the Town of Chatham's Collection System Project will continue with Phase 1C – 3 & 4 and is financed by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF). The CWSRF program is administered by the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) with joint funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. This project will reduce nitrogen loading to Oyster Pond through implementing a sewer collection system in the Phase 1C – 3 & 4 area, which includes the following locations:



The community benefits

- 1 The project includes gravity and low pressure sewers, three new pumping stations (Balfour Lane, Perch Pond Road, and Sky Way), and one odor control facility (Wilfred Road).
- 2 Construction of sewers will reduce the nitrogen loading to our groundwater and sensitive estuaries and will provide water quality benefits for community residents and businesses in Chatham.
- 3 CWSRF programs operate around the country to provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our valuable water resources nationwide.
