Sewer Construction Set to Resume

Chatham – Sewer construction is set to resume in Chatham the week of December 18, 2017, weather permitting.

The Town of Chatham has signed a contract with the Robert B. Our Company of Harwich for sewer installation on various side roads under Phase 1C-2 of the Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan (CWMP). Phase 1C-2 involves a continuation of sewer extensions in the Oyster Pond watershed. Work is expected December 2017 through May 2018, shutdown for the summer from Memorial Day, then resume after Labor Day. Many of the roads in the contract are of relatively short length so impacts will range from several days to approximately 3 weeks for any one road.

The Contractor is expected to mobilize to Chatham on Monday, December 18th with construction starting on Wheldon Way, followed by The Cornfield, and Village Landing. Baring severe winter weather the Contractor is planning to work through the winter construction season.

Additional roads in the contract include: Spinnaker Lane, Earle's Way, Janes Way, Oyster Pond Furlong (drainage), Tabitha Terrace, Absegami Run, Oyster Bluff, Oyster Pond Lane, Independence Lane, Inlet Road, Grist Mill Lane, Tide Mill Lane, Wineberry Way, Shattuck Place, and Shattuck Lane. Further updates will be provided as the work/schedule progresses.

Police Details and signage will be in-place to assist motorists in reaching their destination.

Roads affected by sewer construction will be open nights, weekends, and holidays to all traffic. Work during the Christmas and New Year's weeks will be Wednesday to Friday.

Normal work hours are 7 AM to 5:00 PM Monday to Friday, weather permitting. Work may extend to 7 PM in special circumstances
